A co-product from Ethanol Production



What is Fox River Gold?

Fox River Gold is a co-product derived from the corn ethanol production process, specifically the solid material remaining after starch is removed from corn. After fermentation, the ethanol is harvested, and the resulting by-product is typically dried. However, in the case of Fox River Gold it is diverted straight to the concrete pad and sold as a wet feed. To preserve its quality during warmer months, Fox River Gold is treated with propionic acid.

Fox River Gold is a highly palatable wet feed suitable for all types of ruminants. Its **low-fat** content is less than 6% fat on a dry matter basis.

The protein in Fox River Gold is both degradable and undegradable, making it an excellent concentrate to pair with forages.

Fox River Gold is produced in a world-class ethanol manufacturing facility, ensuring **consistency** and **quality** in every batch. It is safe to include up to 15% of total dry matter intake due to its lower fat and higher fiber content. As with all feeds, inclusion rates should be balanced according to the total dietary needs of the animal.

- **Versatile feeding options:** Can be fed on its own with fiber sources like corn stalks to dry cows, heifers, and stored cattle.

Handling and Storage:

- Store on a dry concrete base.
- For storage up to 1 week: Compact the top of the load against a solid wall. No covering is needed in winter, however in the warmer months, cover with a plastic sheet weighted at the corners.
- For storage beyond 1 week: Always cover. Create a clamp from the material and cover with a sheet. Mixing the feed with fiber absorbents like soybean hulls or beet pulp is recommended to help stack the clamp higher.
- Proper storage is essential to minimize waste. It is advisable to keep at least one week's supply of Fox River Gold in stock. If clamping isn't possible, spreading 30 lbs of salt evenly on the surface can help preserve the feed. Be sure to tamp the surface to make it even before applying the salt.

Fox River Gold is treated with 0.5% propionic acid in the warmer months to extend its shelf life. For further information, please contact us directly or consult with your nutritionist.
